

Charles Lewis Byers

January 12, 1925 - November 15, 2015



Last November we lost one of our most stalwart compatriots, Charles Byers. Known also as "Charlie" or "Chuck," he served both our Chapter and the State Society in a variety of capacities, including Registrar for the State Society for the last 8 years, and he was awarded the Meritorious Service Award. He also served as Chapter Registrar and Chaplain, and was a member of both the State and Chapter Color Guards.

In 2009 he was inducted into the Seattle Pacific University Hall of Fame. He lettered in both basketball and track from 1953 to 1955. He was part of a nationally ranked relay team, which won the 1954 State NAIA finals in the two-mile relay, and placed highly in several other national relay events. He qualified for the nationals in the 440 in 1955. Following many years of coaching both basketball and track at the high school and community college level, including mentoring women's basketball participants, He was inducted into the Washington State Track and Field Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2004.

Besides his active membership in the SAR, he was also a member of the Mayflower Society. He and his wife Virginia enjoyed genealogical research. He is survived by Virginia, sister Cora Portwood, daughter Ronda Howard, son Brent, and three grandchildren. A complete obituary may be found in the Longview Daily News at tdn.com.
